

History

The Queen of the Bay Race is one of the oldest events on Great South Bay. This traditional GSBYRA event, in which yachts of all classes and sizes all start at a common time and all race together on the same course dates back to a few years after the turn of the 20th century. The boat's owner had to belong to a GSBYRA club and had to race the boat on the bay. Handicaps were calculated by a GSBYRA Handicap Chairman.

An original Queen of the Bay Loving Cup was retired by the Q boat *Constance* when owner Regis Post won it three times against *Eagle*, *Doris*, and *Invader*, several other crack Q boats. The Q boats had been designed by Clinton Crane to race against the Canadians for the Seawanhaka Cup. Yet another sterling silver Queen of the Bay Loving Cup was retired in 1923 by the Q boat *Dixie*, owned by the Luderman brothers of Sayville and skippered by Captain Jim Zegel of West Sayville. Other trophies must have existed but both they and their history are lost.

In 1939, a bowl donated by GSBYRA in memory of Harry Growtage became the first of the present Queen of the Bay perpetual trophies to be awarded to the first yacht to finish. Captain John T. Tuthill, publisher of the Patchogue Advance newspaper donated the second trophy in 1956, the Patchogue Advance Trophy for the first yacht to finish on corrected time. That Patchogue Advance Trophy was eventually retired after being won three times and Tuthill replaced it with the Great South Bay Handicap Bowl. Con-

trovery began when the first multihull boat raced and finished first. To quell the dispute, Ted Everitt, a former Commodore of Bellport Bay Yacht Club and a Past President of GSBYRA donated the third trophy in 1962, the Everitt Trophy to be awarded to the first yacht to finish regardless of type of hull or rig. The Growtage Bowl was redesignated for the first conventional, single hull, yacht to finish. Multihull enthusiasts, the Jerome Laviano family, donated the fourth trophy in 1972, the Gallina Cup to be awarded to the first multihull to finish on corrected time.

Periodic reviews have established changes in how yachts qualify to race in Queen of the Bay. At one time yachts had to compete in a percentage of GSBYRA Invitational Regattas. Portsmouth Numbers eventually replaced local bay handicaps to calculate corrected times.

Traditionally Bellport Bay Yacht Club has hosted Queen of the Bay the most times. During Labor Day weekend the Race Committee for the Queen of the Bay strives to set an extremely long course, about eleven miles in length. The start always provides the most excitement when small boats such as the 29er or 420 vie with larger catamarans and PHRF boats, all looking for the best position. In heavy air the race is gruelling for small boats.

Eligibility & Conditions

Yachts and helmsmen, who compete for Queen of the Bay trophies, must comply with the following conditions or be subject to protest. An authorized GSBYRA representative determines whether or not the yacht and helmsman are qualified under these eligibility rules and conditions:

- The helmsman of the yacht must be a member of a GSBYRA Full Member Club.
- The yacht's owner must be a member of a GSBYRA Full Member Club.
- The yacht must have a Portsmouth DPN rating 120 or lower to be eligible. Yachts cor-

rected times are calculated using wind handicaps and the corresponding Portsmouth Numbers from US SAILING.

- All one design yachts must strictly meet class rules regarding sail area, weight, measurement, gear and crew.
- All PHRF yachts must strictly meet and conform to measurements and other data regarding weight, gear and crew, on which their rating is calculated. PHRF yacht owners should apply one month in advance of the race to the GSBYRA Handicap Committee Chairman for a Portsmouth DPN rating.

EVERITT TROPHY

2007 Lawrence Deering; MaryAnn Deering - Tornado Bellport Bay Yacht Club



Awarded to the first yacht, regardless of type of hull or rig, to finish the Queen of the Bay Race, the GSBYRA Everitt Trophy, was donated by Theodore T. Everitt, a Past President of GSBYRA 1944-1946. As the Bellport Bay Yacht Club Delegate to GSBYRA in 1962, Everitt recognized the need to resolve controversy caused by multihull boats. A common start for all classes of yachts and helmsmen that meet requirements and sail the same course is tradition. Both the yacht and the helmsman must be from a GSBYRA Full Member Club. The Race Committee strives to set a course about eleven miles long.

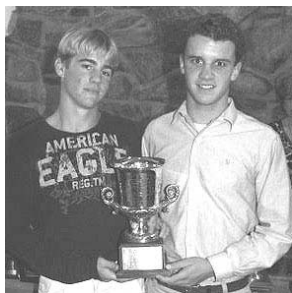

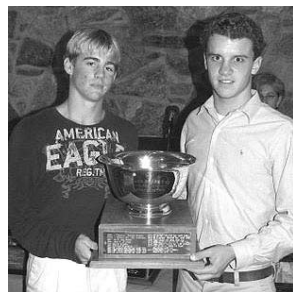
