1. RULES

- 1.1 The Junior Regattas are organized by the Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association (GSBYRA) and hosted by GSBYRA Full Member Clubs.
- 1.2 The Junior Regattas will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.3 The Junior Regattas are not being conducted as sanctioned or class association events.
- 1.4 The Equipment Measurement Rules for the Club 420, Sunfish, Mercury and Laser Classes will apply.
- 1.5 GSBYRA COVID Safety Protocol measures shall be in effect for all GSBYRA events until further notice. See <https://docs.google.com/document/d/1qDsEMme8UKjXGSF4yCkihIqk9Oz2WgEz00donD5V9-l/edit>

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The Junior Regattas are open to all boats of the Optimist, Club 420, Laser, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7, Sunfish, Mercury, Pixel, Blue Jay, O'Pen Bic, RS Quest, and foiling UFO classes.
- 2.2 Competitors must be an individual member or a family member of a Full Member Club of GSBYRA or a registered participant in a sailing program.
- 2.3 Competitors must not have reached their 20th birthday during the calendar year in which these regattas are held.
- 2.4 For Season Scoring Optimist White and Blue Fleet competitors may elect to remain in the Fleet designated based on their age at their first Junior Regatta of the season, and at following Junior Regattas they shall
3. inform the registrar to manually override their age designated fleet.

3. REGISTRATION AND ENTRY

Registration may be made by completing the online registration form for the regatta at the Schedule page on the GSBYRA website: www.gsbyra.org

4. SCHEDULE – Subject to change based on when GSBYRA Covid Safety Protocol measures permit these activities.

0800 to 1000	Registration and check in

1030	Warning Signal for first race
1530	No Warning Signal will be made after 3:30 pm Refreshments & Awards after last race

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS - Sailing Instructions will be available at the competitors meeting and registration.

6. PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICES (PFD) AND PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

RRS 40.1 applies for all Junior Regattas. Each competitor shall wear a personal flotation device except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices.

7. HEARING REQUEST - The Race Committee shall be informed as soon as possible after a race by any boat that intends to protest another boat. Hearing Request Forms either for a Protest or Request for Redress will be available at the Registration Desk and must be filed with the Protest Committee within 30 minutes of the Race Committee docking after racing. This changes RRS 61.3. Time of Race Committee boat docking will be posted at the Registration Desk.

8. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded for the top three finishers in each class racing. Final Scoring for all fleets will be given to the GSBYRA Official scorer to determine GSBYRA Club and Individual Season trophies.

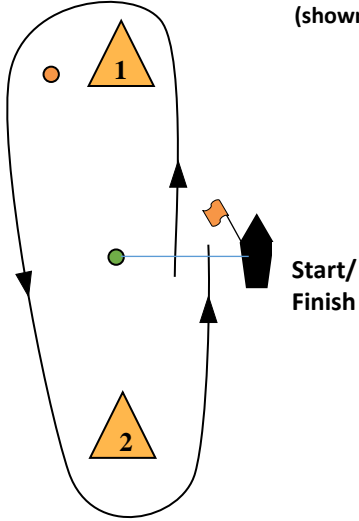
Sailing Instructions

1. **RULES:** This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
2. **NOTICES TO COMPETITORS** will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
3. **CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS** may be given on the water by the Race Committee with Race Flag L displayed so that each competitor will be told of the changes prior to their Warning Signal with their acknowledgement of the changes. RRS 90.2 (c) applies.
4. **SCHEDULE OF RACING – Subject to change based on when GSBYRA Covid Safety Protocol measures permit these activities.**

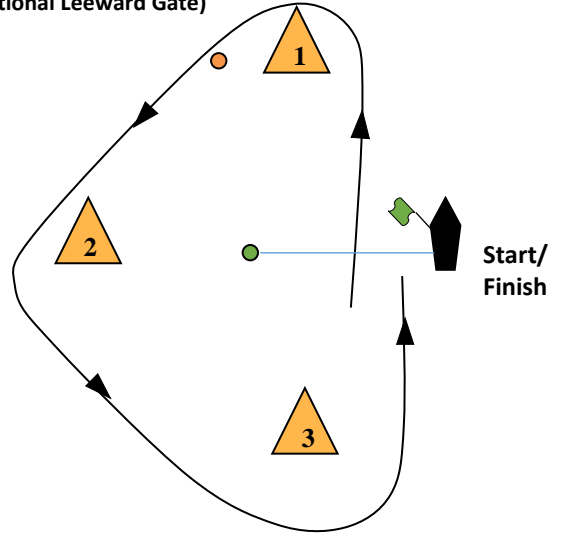
0800-1000	Registration and check in
0930	Meeting of Senior Instructors or representatives from all participating clubs
1000	Competitors Meeting
1030	Warning Signal for First Race. Six races are scheduled
1530	No Warning Signal will be made after this Time Refreshments & Awards after last race
5. **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS** will be available at the competitors meeting.
6. **RACING AREA** will be on waters adjacent to the Host Club.
7. **COURSES** will be announced at Competitors Meeting. Course Diagrams will either be on a white board or printed.
8. **MARKS** are inflatable marks.
9. **THE START** - Races will be started using Appendix U. The START/FINISH Line will be between an Orange Flag on the Port side of the Signal boat and an orange flag on the Starboard side of a boat at the Port end of the line or a mark at the port end of the line. **(Competitors shall check in with the Race Committee Signal boat before First Warning Signal)**. The Start/Finish Line may be considered an Obstruction during Race.
10. **SCORING**
 - 10.1 Six Races are scheduled.
 - 10.2 One Race is required to be completed to constitute a Series.
 - 10.3 Appendix A2.1 is modified as follows: When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her races scored. When 6 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. Boats failing to Finish within 10 minutes of the First Boat that sails the course and Finishes a race may be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired = DNF) without a hearing (this changes A5).
11. **HEARING REQUEST - The Race Committee shall be informed as soon as possible after a race by any boat that intends to protest another boat.** Hearing Request forms either for a Protest or Request for Redress will be available at the Registration Desk and must be filed with the Protest Committee within 30 minutes of the Race Committee docking after racing. This changes RRS 61.3. Time of Race Committee boat docking will be posted at the Registration Desk.
12. **PRIZES** - Prizes will be awarded for the top 3 finishers in each class racing. Final Scoring for all fleets will be given to the GSBYRA Official Scorer to determine GSBYRA Club and Individual Season trophies.

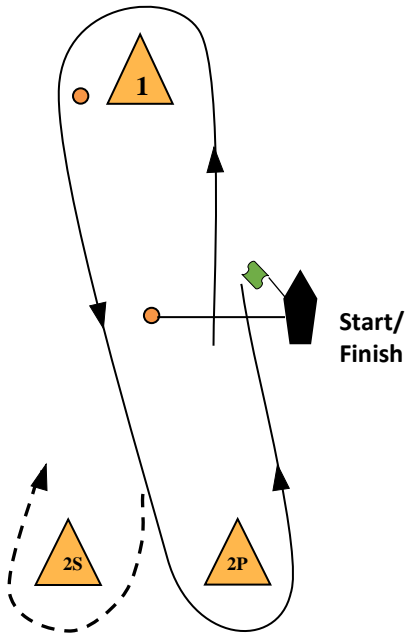


Windward Leeward Once Around

SF - 1 - 2 - SF

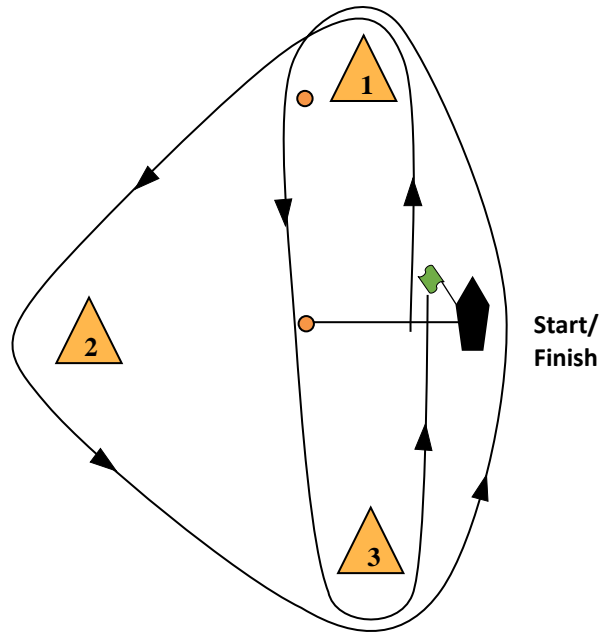
Windward Leeward Twice Around

6 marks to be rounded
SF - 1 - 2 - 3 - 1 - 2 - 3 - SF

Windward Leeward with Leeward Gate
Boats may round either leeward gate mark, but must pass through the gate in a direction away from the windward mark.

Triangle Windward Leeward Windward
5 marks to be rounded
